

In these readings you will learn about God who gives us life. Who is He? What has He done? Does He care about us? What does He want from us? Why is it so wrong to worship and serve any person, object or thing other than God?

Summary:

You saw that the God who created you also loves you and wants you to seek, worship and glorify Him. This Wonderful God is powerful and “able to do infinitely more than anything we can ask or think” (Ephesians 3:20). He gave us His Son, Jesus, as a great demonstration of His love. Summary

In these verses you saw that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God, the Way, the Truth and the Life, the only way for us to get to God The Father, the Savior, the perfect and only sacrifice capable of paying for our sins. And he is much more! Try to discover other truths about Jesus in your Bible reading. But you should already understand why the Bible says that “there is no other name under heaven, given to men, by whom we may be saved.” (Acts 4:12) You need Jesus to save you from your sins.

Summary

We see that Jesus is the Lord of all, and that, in practice, this truth means that he is the one who controls the life of the true Christian. You cannot think about being a Christian without bowing before Jesus, and surrendering the control of your life into his hands. Nobody can become a Christian without deciding to obey Him. The Christian's goal is to be like him and obedient to him in everything. But remember the high price Jesus paid to be your Lord. He gave his life for you and now requires that you live for him. Reflect on these truths. Ask yourself if you are ready to call Jesus Lord, knowing the commitment that this confession implies in your life.

WHY DID JESUS HAVE TO DIE?



Summary

You should now know that you, like the rest of us, are a sinner who deserves God's condemnation and death. But "God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten son" in order to be able to give us life. Jesus, because he loves you, was crucified on the cross of Calvary to pay the price for all your sins. Now you need to reflect on this because each one of us has to decide how we will react to these truths. If you decide that you want to be forgiven of your sins, you will want to know how to receive forgiveness and pass from death to life.

WHAT MUST I DO TO BE FORGIVEN OF MY SINS?

In these readings you will learn what you must do in order to receive forgiveness of your sins and eternal life.

Summary

For you to leave behind the world of sin and become a Christian, you must hear and understand the good news of Jesus Christ. Believe that Jesus is the Son of God who lived a sinless life, died on the cross in your place and then rose from the dead on the third day. You must repent of your sins, deciding sincerely that you are going to live in submission to the Lord Jesus. You must confess Him as Lord and be baptized (immersed) in water, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Doing this, you begin the Christian life, free of the fear of God's punishment and secure in the hope of eternal life in Christ. Stop now and reflect on your need to become a Christian. If you have already been converted to Christ, ask yourself if your conversion was according to the Bible or not. But before making such an important decision, you should know about the commitment that the true Christian assumes.

Summary

The Christian life is a life of participation and involvement in the church, in evangelism and in good works. To be a Christian means a serious commitment that you must think about beforehand. But remember, there is no salvation in any other way.

HOW TO KEEP YOUR ETERNAL LIFE

In these readings you will learn how to remain in possession of eternal life that God gave you when you became a Christian. Remember that many may say "I am a Christian" or "I am saved" but the life of a true Christian will reveal itself in deeds.

1. 1 John 1:5-7 - "This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin."

2. 1 John 2:9 - "Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness."

3. 1 John 2:3-6 - "We know that we have come to know him if we obey his commands. The man who says, "I know him," but does not do what he commands is a liar, and the truth is not in him. 4. 1 John 4:1,6 - "Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. ... "We are from God, and whoever knows God listens to us; but whoever is not from God does not listen to us. This is how we recognize the Spirit of truth and the spirit of falsehood."

Summary

The Christian life is a life dedicated to the goal of every day becoming more like Jesus. This life begins when you believe in Jesus, repent of your sins and are baptized in the name of Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. This life is maintained as long as you continue to walk in the light (loving the brothers, obeying Jesus and believing the doctrine of Christ). This is the life worthy of the Lord. Reflect a while on the value and beauty of the truly Christian life. Don't be deceived by the life of some so-called "Christians" who profess it but do not live it. Jesus calls us to live the higher life, the life that is worthy of him.

9. If you answered "YES" to all these questions, then prayerfully read Acts 22:16 – "And now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord" and 2 Thessalonians 1:6-9 ... "since it is a righteous thing with God to repay with tribulation those who trouble you, and to give you who are troubled rest with us when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with His mighty angels, in flaming fire taking vengeance on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. These shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power..."

These passages should motivate you to think seriously about your decision to obey the gospel of Jesus Christ. Meditate about this before making any decision but notice the urgency of being saved. Remember that no one knows the day or the hour when the Lord will return. The decision is yours. Do you really want to become a true Christian, freed from the guilt of sin? Do you want to escape death and enter into eternal life?

Those who accept God's message are added by God to Christ Body, His Church.

God's Invitation to the World

Matt 11:28-30 "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."

1 Corinthians 2:9-11 "But as it is written: 'Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, Nor have entered into the heart of man The things which God has prepared for those who love Him.' But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God. For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God."

Matthew 28:18-20 "And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, 'All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.' Amen."

Mark 1:14-15 Jesus came to Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Matthew 6:33-34 "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be

added to you. Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.”

Romans 6:16-19 “Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness? But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered. And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness. I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh.

“For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness.”

Acts 4:10-12 “Let it be known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by Him this man stands here before you whole. This is the 'stone which was rejected by you builders, which has become the chief cornerstone.' Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.”

There is No Guarantee of a Tomorrow

The tragedy is that nobody has to lose Heaven and gain Hell. The choice is ours. We are free to determine our own eternal destiny. Heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people and Hell is a place prepared for an unprepared people.

2 Corinthians 6:2 “Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.”

John 15:10 “If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in his love.”

Conclusion

Those “In Christ” living for the AFTER-LIFE must be aware of temptations constantly set before them by the Devi. There are examples in both the Old Testament and New Testament of God’s children disobeying God and going back into the ways of the world.

Those not “In Christ” who desire to be His Child need to seriously consider what the Bible has told others to do.

Hear

- Study diligently and read what Christ taught for they are the Words of life.

Understand

- All men are sinful having disobeyed God’s righteous ways and commands
- All have sinned and not living according to God’s commands
- One’s sin will result in their eternal death
- One must be forgiven to have eternal life with God
- Christ is the only way for one to be forgiven of all their sins

Believe

- Jesus Was and is God
- He came to earth in human flesh as Jesus of Nazareth
- He lived among men
- He willingly gave His sinless physical life as the perfect sacrifice for my sins, being crucified
- He was buried

- God raised Him from the grave on the third day
- He appeared to hundreds following His resurrection
- He ascended back to heaven to be with the Father

Repent

- Change from sin and disobedience to trust and obedience

Confess

- Acknowledge publicly your belief that Jesus is the Son of God.

Seek

- Call upon God to forgive you of your sins

Die

- Put to death your old, sinful, worldly life

Be Buried

- Bury your sinful life you put to death in the grave of baptism by water immersion into the death, burial and resurrection of Christ, allowing God to raise you from the grave as a new Creation, cleansed of sin.

Receive

- The Holy Spirit as a deposit guaranteeing what is to come

Become

- As a new Christian God added you as His adopted child to the other children into the Church Christ established.

Live

- Continue to live steadfastly and obediently to Christ and the apostles teachings “I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace” (Ephesians 4:1-3).
